

Twenty years ago, Zoë's terminally ill mother decided to euthanise herself. Zoë was faced with the harsh reality that assisted dying was not accessible to patients in Australia. 'I felt broken by her death, by the way she died and by the terrible fact that I couldn't help her.'

Inspired by Zoë's vehement advocacy for euthanasia law and the right to die, Where the Light Gets In tells the story of Delphi Hoffman, a wild child who is finally getting her life together – until she receives the phone call, from her terminally ill mother that she hoped would never arrive. Her mother asks her to fly to Tasmania from the United Kingdom to help her die.

Mesmerising and moving, it was the birth of Zoë's first child that was the catalyst for her debut novel. The birth marked a turning point in which she took stock of who she was, her history, and who she wanted to be.
